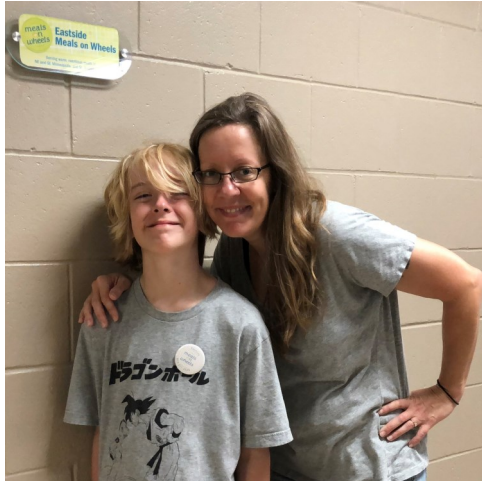

Meet Felix!



It was less an accounting error than a revelation.

Ten-year-old Felix Knoke's first donation to Eastside Meals on Wheels (EMOW) occurred as a preschooler. He convinced his mother to let him shove some money into a EMOW's donation box in a Johnson St. business in northeast Minneapolis. "I asked my mom for a dollar," Felix said. "He got excited about it," his mother, Maggie Knoke, recalled. Felix has kept the donations coming.

Honoring the family's philosophy of contributing a slice of their income to good works, Felix has dutifully donated about \$160 to Meals on Wheels. Donations will continue, he indicated. Indeed, when he gets a little older, he envisions himself making (EMOW) deliveries. "Definitely," he said. Felix is not giving away someone else's money. It's his. He earns it by

doing household chores, such as the laundry and sorting the garbage for recycling.

His generosity might have gone unnoticed hadn't the family, in sorting out charitable tax information with EMOW, explained who was making the donations and suggested Felix get credit for his generosity. EMOW staff were delighted.

The Knoke's were invited to tour the EMOW facility in August, Volunteer Appreciation Month. "We got to see the kitchen," Felix said. That day the meal happened to be Felix's favorite: hot dog, baked beans, homemade cookie — the works. Fortified with ice cream, Felix rode away on his bicycle with his savory token of appreciation.

A giving spirit fills Felix and his family. And they act on it. Even things like children's birthday parties serve to generate money for good works. Charity begins at home, it is said. For Felix, the giving spirit was already tugging at his heart when he still counted birthdays on one hand.
